



With the cost of cloth napkins up to \$15.00 and more... MAKE YOUR OWN in minutes for a fraction of the cost!

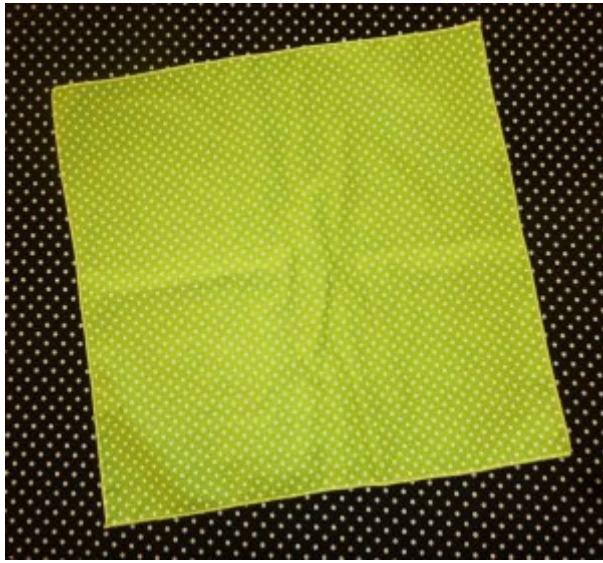
Napkins using your serger are easy!

In the pictures I have used 15" squares and simply serged a rolled edge around the sides either a single layer of fabric or 2 squares of complimentary fabrics.

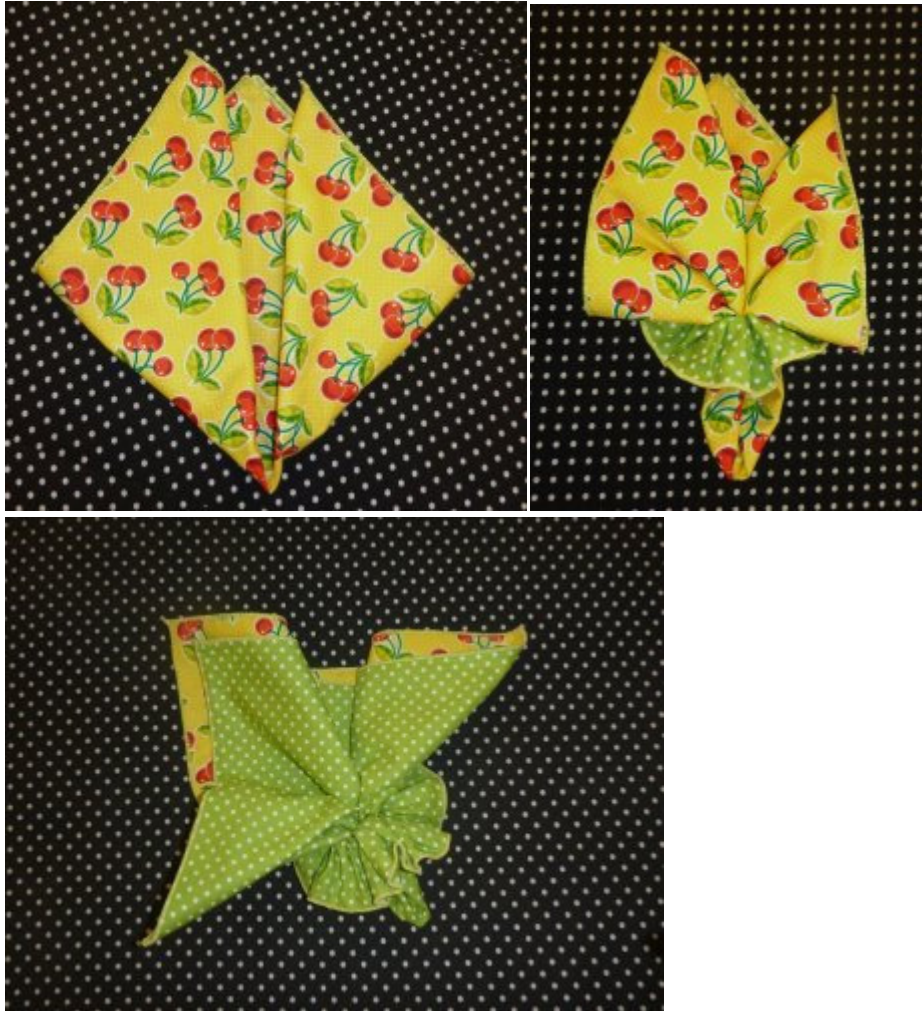
3/4 of a yard will yield you 3 single layer napkins and 4 napkin rings (scrunchies!)

Your serger should be set for a narrow rolled edge. I used woolly nylon in the upper looper for the project samples shown. Woolly Nylon is great for rolled edge where you want the threads to fill in some gaps.

Again, simply serge around each side cutting previous serger chains as you go around. leave the last serger chain an inch or two long. Dot EACH corner as well as the corner with the chain with fray check or similar product. Let the Fray check dry before cutting the tail off.



See the scrunchie instruction and once the napkins are done... just fold and poke the folded point through the scrunchie.



The scrunchie will also allow you to place flatware right in with the napkin! Great for every day, special picnics, weddings, or other parties.



Scrunchies can also be used at the base of a taper to add a coordinated look to your table!
